near you. What do you notice?

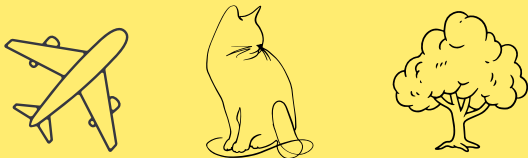
What can you touch?

2. DEVELOP

Take one of the objects

EXAMPLES

make a mistake.

I see **trees** when I look out of my
window. My voice is a tree because
it's **rooted** in family and history.

I hear **motorcycles** outside. My voice is
the engine of a motorcycle. Because it
can **startle** people.
