



## Why now?


The Portico is creaking and leaking from old age and needs critical repairs before it degrades further. Our entrance is hard to find, and our facilities aren't accessible to all.

We want everyone to be inspired by the fascinating stories, illustrations, people and ideas of fund only here.


However, unless we act today, and secure your help, we simply can't keep the Portico library running, let alone welcome all of the people who want to explore and join the adventure.
